From the AGM

More than thirty members attended the November 18 Annual General Meeting of Parklands Golf Club. We received reports from Ron Oakley, Heather Hay and of course from our Treasurer, Tim Spillman. Wilky has a good summary of Ron and Heather's reports in his column. Whilst our current financial position shows a credit balance of some \$19,000 we should keep in mind that we have many commitments, and some ageing equipment that will require replacement sooner or later. The rough cutter for example, will require replacement at some time in the near future. New units cost around \$25,000-\$30,000!

No changes were made to the fee structure so a full adult membership is still only \$150.

Machinery Replacement Fund

Money will be directed to the Fund via a small increase in competition day fees. As from 1st October fees were increased as follows:

Wednesday events \$8
Monday and Saturday events \$10

As a bonus to members, all completed competition scorecards will be retained as entry tickets into a major **members only** prize draw, that will take place at each Annual Presentation. The first draw will be in November 2020. Whilst we are unable to publish the prize list at this early stage, it will include prizes from sponsors, and free golf membership for the ensuing year. We are confident that you will see the value in, and necessity for, this decision. It will enable our Club to support its membership into the future, with a golf course and facilities of which we can all be proud.
